Happy Half Term! You and your families have been working so hard – well done everyone. Make sure that you have some time this week to just relax and have fun. If you would like, this week's project is on: Pirates! Showcase your learning however you wish me hearties!

- Why are pirate jokes so funny? Because they ARRRRRRRRRRRRRRRR Do you know any pirate jokes? Share them with your family, friends and us! Could you create your own pirate joke book?
- X marks the spot! Hide some treasure for someone to find then create a treasure map to lead them to it. Don't make it too easy give them clues to follow using compass directions and maybe even some riddles to solve!
- Hoist the Mainsail! Can you design your own pirate ship? Maybe you could build it using Lego or recycling. Don't forget to include a flag in your design!
