<u>Reading</u>

- 1 Read through the examples of instructions, what do you notice? What do they all involve? What is the purpose of the text?
- 2 To read 'How Dinosaurs Really Work', Who do you think the text is aimed at? Why? Try writing your own text called 'How children really work'.
- 3 Try reading some of the '60 second' reading comprehensions. Can you retrieve the information?

Writing - To write a set of instructions

- 1 Take time to invent a potion of your choice. What does it do? How does it work? What are the ingredients? Jot down all of your ideas.
- 2 You will use command sentences to create your instructions. Watch https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zrqqtfr/articles/z8strwx. Can you write down 10 imperative verbs, then can you write a command sentence for each? Make sure you use capital letters and full stops.
- 3 Complete the 'command sentence or question' activity. Can you now create some of your own?
- 3 Write out your instructions for the potion using command sentences you may use the special potion template.

BONUS - Can you write a fact file about a famous inventor?

Whole School Project for all ages:

For the next weeks we are going to be focusing Inventions - You can showcase your learning however you wish!

Here are some ideas to help you to focus your learning or you could come up with a list of your own questions that you want to investigate:

- Research some famous inventors and create your own FlipFlap book (See attached documents), or PowerPoint.
- Alexander Graham Bell invented the telephone. Try making your own cup phones. This will help you think about how sound travels through the air in waves. Can you send a message from one cup to the other?
- Try making your own cup phone https://raisinglifelonglearners.com/string-telephone-explanation/
- Can you invent your own robot out of recycled materials. What does it do? How does it help?
- Learn about the Wright brothers via You Tube https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fZyZxDWjkZ0. How could you present your findings?
- Imagine a new invention has been made at school and you want it to be delivered to your house. Can you draw a map of how the new invention would travel from Goldsborough to your house? You will need to think whether it could be walked to your house or whether it would need transportation. Which roads would it take? Can you map it out? You may need some help from Google maps.
- Can you invent a new maths board game? Can you include some number bonds, times table or mental maths questions as part of your game? Think carefully about the design of your game and make sure you write a clear set of rules.
- Create a new iphone case. Think about which materials you will use to draw? Can you find different materials around the house to help make it colourful?
