### Whole School Project for all ages:

For the next few weeks we are going to be focusing on the continents. We have already learned a lot about Antarctica during Penguin Week, so this week you could choose to learn about Europe or Asia or both! - You can showcase your learning however you wish!

Here are some ideas to help you to focus your learning or you could come up with a list of your own questions that you want to investigate:

- Where is this continent? Can you find it on a world map? Could you draw, paint or model your own world map? Can you name some countries that are part of this continent? - What plants and animals would I see on this continent? Could you draw them or tell us about their habitat?
- What is the landscape like there? Are there any famous mountains or rivers you could learn about? Are there any famous man-made landmarks you would go and visit? Take a trip using Google maps and fly above the continent. If you see something interesting then zoom in and have a closer look I wonder what you might find! Imagine you have been to visit one of these places and make a postcard with a picture on the front and a description of your visit on the back.
- Can you find examples of famous artwork from this continent? Could you recreate some of it? Are there any famous musicians from this continent? Have you heard any of their music before?


