More news about changes to school meals

We are changing catering provider. From 19th February, school meals will be supplied by North Yorkshire County Caterers. NYC Caterers promise to provide healthy meals, cooked fresh each day. The meals will be cooked at Sicklinghall so the children will not notice any difference day to day.

We are also changing the way parents order and pay for meals. Until North Yorkshire Caterers are fully established on site at Sicklinghall, we cannot yet offer an online ordering system to parents. In the short term we will be using a paper-based system, and menus and order sheets will be sent home soon. Whilst this may seem old fashioned, we are keen to give parents the chance to continue choosing the meal their child would like most. If you do not want to receive paper order sheets (i.e. if your child ALWAYS brings a packed lunch) please tell Mrs Reeve and Mrs Foster in the office by email.

Eventually you will be able to order meals and pay* (not FSM children) via ParentPay - we will advise when this facility is available.

Information for all settings

There have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates.

Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.
