## **Re: Staffing Updates**

Dear Parents and Carers,

The last year has been such a difficult time for everyone. Mental Health struggles have understandably been prevalent as we have never been through a Global Pandemic before. People, including our staff, have been isolated from their families and friends and the rapid changes in the expectation of the education system have been tough.

It has been particularly difficult for trainee teachers who missed over a term of their final teacher training placement in Summer 2020 due to the first lockdown.
