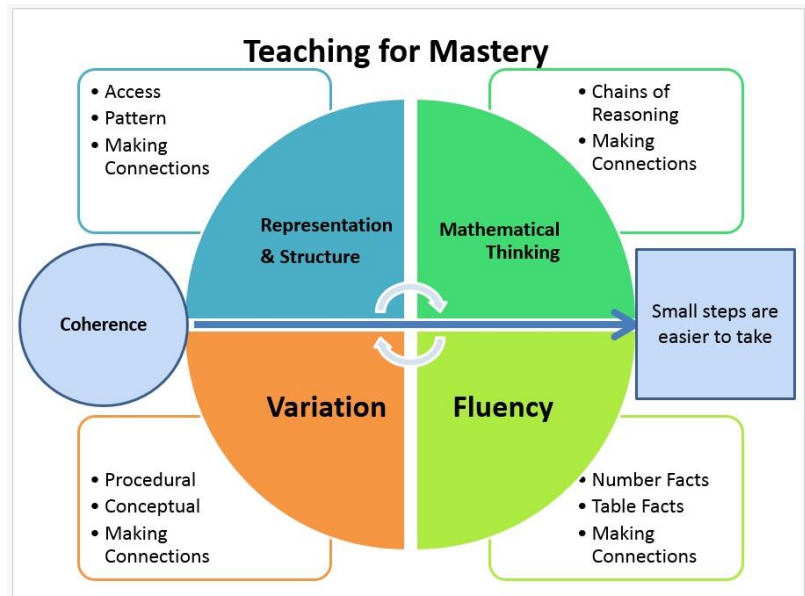

How can I help my child at home?

Recently we sent home the KIRFs for each year group. Our federation focus in maths this term is to develop children's understanding of 'Fluency'. Teachers began our training day working with a Maths Mastery expert to ensure that the activities presented in daily fluency work are challenging and varied.

Variation of question style and fluency are key aspects of helping children to make connections to ensure that children develop their mathematical understanding.



Though the facts outlined on the KIRFs may seem simple, presenting them in a variety of ways embeds these facts so that children have a deep understanding and instant recall of each. As you have been informed, this year we will be putting emphasis on the practise of KIRFs both as part of Homework and in school. The KIRFs have 'Key Vocabulary', 'Practical Ideas' and 'Games' to help to build confidence.
